

SR-60 Corridor Improvement at Ramona Avenue Overcrossing in the City of Chino 55 - Hour Weekend Closure September 23-26, 2022

SAN BERNARDINO, CA – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) informs the public that construction contractors will perform pavement work and lane closures for the \$8.7 million State Route 60 (SR-60) Corridor Improvement Project at Ramona Avenue Overcrossing in the City of Chino.

A FULL 55-HOUR WEEKEND CLOSURE will begin at 11:00 p.m. on Friday, September 23 and continue to 5:00 a.m. on Monday, September 26. Work will require WEST-BOUND (WB) FULL MAINLINE closures on SR-60 at Ramona Avenue. Traffic will be rerouted at the Ramona Ave. off-ramp back to SR-60. Anticipate traffic delays! Closures are dependent on contractor receiving proper materials for each job function. They can be changed or canceled at any time.

Additional signage will be put in place on SR-60, I-15 and SR-71, instructing the public to utilize detours to avoid delays. Traffic will be rerouted at the Ramona Ave. off-ramp back to SR-60. PLAN AHEAD and drive safely being mindful of closures and alternate routes. CONSIDER using alternate routes, SR-71, SR-91, I-10 and I-210. IF POSSIBLE, avoid WB SR-60. THIS IS AN ACTIVE WORK ZONE causing lane closures and traffic delays.

The current posted speed limit on SR-60 is 55 mph following Construction Work Zone Speed Limit Reduction provisions.

Semi-trucks and oversized vehicles take precaution. Drive safely being mindful of no truck signage, clearance, and low width zones. To avoid traffic delays consider using alternate routes on SR-71, SR-91, I-10 or I-210, to access surrounding communities.

Local residents and businesses please note that significant noise may occur near and surrounding the construction zone.

The project is expected to be complete in late 2023. Please use caution and reduce your speed in the construction zone.
